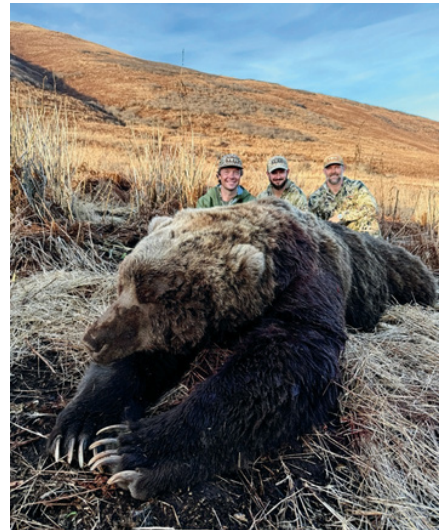

2025 Summary and 2026 Forecast

The 2025 spring bear season saw slower hunting again as Kodiak had another cold, late spring, with many bears emerging late. Harvest was down but we persevered. Fall bear season saw a healthy salmon run and good hunting. Mountain goat season went well even with relentless fog! Perseverance and patience paid off with all but one hunter taking goats, but we'll get Greg Fricks his goat yet! Our deer population saw a healthy increase; hunting was great with many nice bucks harvested.

The 2026 season looks promising for bear and mountain goat hunting. Populations remain very strong, and while afield we're seeing a good number of mature animals. Deer hunting is likely to be very good as our population increases, but we'll need a break from the cold December weather! As always, we'll monitor closely before making decisions to offer deer hunts, ensuring reasonable harvest opportunity.
